### **Your student visa**

Your student visa entitles you to study in New Zealand on the condition that you undertake study in the course, education provider and location endorsed on your visa. Any change to these study conditions will require approval from Immigration New Zealand.

If you stop attending or withdraw from the course and/or education provider endorsed on your visa before obtaining a variation of conditions (or a further student visa) you will be in breach of your visa conditions. People who breach their visa conditions may not ordinarily be granted further visas (or a variation of conditions) and may become liable for deportation.

### **Conditions of your student visa**

It is important that you read and understand the conditions of your visa, including your visa expiry date and whether you are able to undertake employment in New Zealand. Other conditions of a student visa include the requirements that you must attend your course of study and make satisfactory progress. If you fail to meet any of the conditions of your visa you may not be granted a further visa to stay.

While you are in New Zealand, you must hold a valid visa at all times. If you need to extend your stay, you must apply for a new visa before your current visa expires, or you will be in New Zealand unlawfully. We encourage you to apply at least 30 days before the expiry date on your visa.

Please contact us if you wish to change any of the conditions of your student visa.

### **Liability for deportation and appeal rights**

You must hold a valid visa at all times during your stay and depart New Zealand before it expires. If you remain after it expires you will be in New Zealand unlawfully and will be liable for deportation. If you are deported from New Zealand, you will be unable to return until the end of any prohibition period and until you have paid any costs of your deportation. If you are in New Zealand unlawfully and depart voluntarily you may still be deemed to be deported, but you will not be subject to any prohibition period.

If you wish to appeal against your liability for deportation, you may do so on humanitarian grounds no later than 42 days after first being in New Zealand unlawfully. ### **Your Documents**

If your application was submitted by your education provider through the student's online facility, you will need to contact your education provider after 2 – 3 working days for collection of your passport and student visa.
